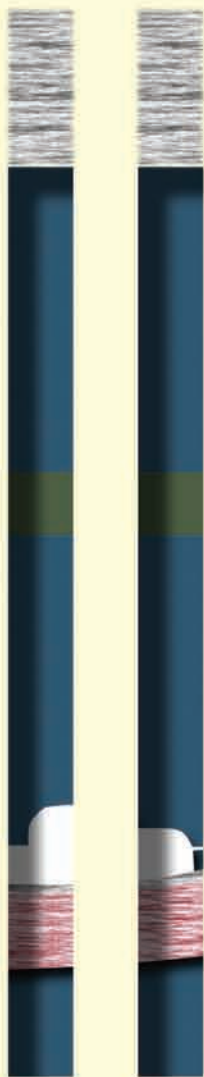

The festival celebrates the creative talent of these harbour communities together with visiting artists from East Lothian, Edinburgh and beyond.

You will be delighted to find art in unusual places. You may come across a promenading piano, fishes on heads, Jacobites and galoshins, stitchers and stitching and a painting or two.

Inspired by Port Seton Harbour and the local architecture, Diane created this piece from layers of hand printed card which she then scapel-cut into shape. Diane will be exhibiting sculptures in Cockenzie House (V14) and framed artwork in her regular venue on the High Street in Cockenzie (V24).

festival highlights 2013

There will be a preview show on the 31st May at Cockenzie House from 19.00 – 21.30. Meet the artists and take this early opportunity to acquire an original work of art. "Sonsie Sangs" will provide the musical entertainment.

Prestonpans Weekend OUR STORY

The first weekend of the festival is a celebration of Prestonpans and its history. It begins with the unveiling of a new community mural and an opening parade. Enjoy a diverse range of events from battle re-enactments, to exploring an historic house. The finale to the weekend will be on Sunday, when the murals from Prestoungrange Museum to The Prestoungrange Gothenburg are brought to life by the Prestoungrange Players.

The incredible **Battle of Prestonpans Tapestry** returns 'home' for a week. Make sure that you see the 105 metre tapestry designed by **Andrew Crummy** and embroidered by over 200 volunteers. Get a preview of the next Prestoungrange Arts Festival project. The Scottish Diaspora Tapestry due for completion in 2014 for the Year of the Homecoming, will include 25 countries across the world. Panels from Barga, Italy and Gothenburg, Sweden will be on display.

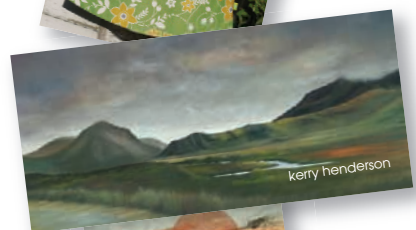
Cockenzie House will show the largest mixed media exhibition in East Lothian. Over 150 artworks will go on display both in this house, dating from the 16th century, and in the beautiful gardens. **Alex Hewitt**, photographer and Deputy Picture Editor at The Scotsman has taken photographs of Cockenzie Power Station and of the people who worked there. The photographic installation in the grounds will in Alex's words, "document these unsung heroes in their environment..."

Village properties. Don't forget to meander through the streets of the villages, where you will be able to sample the delights of the artwork on sale and meet the artists. Individual householders continue to support the Festival by allowing artists to use their properties as boutique-style galleries bringing the Festival and the community together, making it a sustainable part of this exciting event. This has been the backbone of the Festival from the very beginning. It gives the theme 'Artwork in Unusual Places' the true meaning and ethos of the Festival.

Cockenzie Methodist Church opened for the first time as a venue last year and is a beautiful setting for art. This was the third of East Lothian's Primitive Methodist Chapels and it was built in 1878. It was erected on land gifted to the church by James Reekie, a local boat builder.

We have two historic buildings opening their doors for viewing, one in Prestonpans and one in Port Seton. **Walford House**, originally built in 1757, is opening to the public for the first time during the festival. Features include the painted glass windows by J.A.S. Salmon, a friend of Charles Rennie Mackintosh.

Chalmers Memorial Church is a must see! The church is a category A listed building with a unique stenciled interior and original timber carving. The church building is virtually as it was on the day of the first service on 1 April 1905, with many of the original arts and crafts features still in use. Guides will be on hand to show you around this exuberant interior. The adjacent hall is the second largest venue with a range of artworks including **John P. Johnston's** sought after wooden furniture, jewellery, sculptural objects and textiles by **Liz Neilson** and **Ann Dickson**.

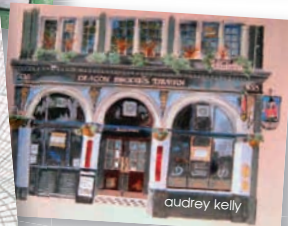
The Cockenzie and Port Seton Fishermen's Society was established in 1813 to support the widows of fishermen, and those who were injured at sea.

The Wiles Bus Company was established by Terence Wrigley in the late 1920s and operated in the Port Seton/Prestonpans area until the end of the 1980s.

James Limerick built the vast majority of the models.
